The Summer Food Service Program is back this summer for the Benson Schools. We will be going back to the normal program. What does this mean for you? Well, here is a breakdown of the differences from last summer to this summer.

Children will eat in our elementary cafeteria during breakfast and lunch. No bulk meal pickup.	We served bulk weekly meals for families that parents could pick up for their children.	
We will serve free meals for student aged 0-18 at: • Breakfast from 7:30 - 8:30 a.m. • Lunch from 11:00 - 12:00 p.m.	Parents picked up bulk breakfast and lunch once a week.	
We will have a mobile site at the high school to serve free bag meals to any students ages 0-18. Times vary, refer to the High School menu.	We only had pickup at the elementary.	

Meals will still be free to any child aged 0-18 years old. Parents cannot pick up meals for them as the child must come to the site to eat.

Federal and State COVID-19 Funding Expenditures

Over the past two years COVID-19 has been at the forefront of much discussion. To combat the economic impact of COVID-19 on individuals and organizations, the Federal Government provided funding sources to assist in different ways, most of the funds flowed through the state.

Benson Public Schools received COVID-19 funds through ten different "buckets" from the Federal and State governments. The funds in each "bucket" must be spent on specific things. The School Board and administration have worked diligently and strategically to use this money in the most resourceful and impactful manner. Given it is one-time money and the funds will no longer be available, the District focused on funding one-time, long term projects. The district does have to apply to the state and receive pre-approval to spend the pandemic related funds.

In total, Benson Schools has received \$2,037,000 in COVID-19 funding through ARP, ESSER I, GEER I, CARES, ESSER II, ESSER III, MN COVID Testing, and Pandemic Enrollment Loss. Depending upon the source, final expenditure dates varied, though final expenditure must be made by September of 2024.

Below is a listing of the main items for the COVID related funds:

- PPE (Personal Protective Equipment)
- Additional nursing time
- Technology devices and equipment so students and staff can be connected while at home
- Replace NS windows to improve indoor air quality (to be completed summer 2022)
- Additional Social Worker time
- Install Mini Split Units for each NS classroom to improve indoor air quality (completed summer 2021)
- Expanded programming for students after school and during the summer
- Additional Student Support Time
- New curriculum (textbooks) that have on-line access for use with devices and remote learning
- Additional cleaning supplies
- Additional custodial time for cleaning and sanitizing

Thank you to the Benson School Board for their dedicated work to focus on strategically spending COVID funds that most directly impact and support students and student learning, without adding on-going costs. These expenditures will have positive and long-lasting benefits for students.

Summer Building Project Plans

To continue to ensure the school buildings and grounds are maintained, Benson Schools will be completing several projects this summer. The projects are listed below with the funds used to pay for the work:

- 1. Refinish Northside Gym Floor. The floor will be sanded down, refinished, and new lines put on the floor using LTFM (Long Term Facilities Maintenance) funds.
- 2. Replace original windows at Northside Elementary School. The windows will be much more energy efficient and allow for better indoor air quality for students and staff using ESSER Funds.
- 3. Resurface drive by football field and parking area by storage shed and van storage shed by football field/track area. Also, resurface parking lot on the east side of Benson High School using LTFM (Long Term Facilities Maintenance) funds.
- 4. Restripe parking lots at BHS and at Discovery Kids using Capital funds.

Maintenance of the buildings and grounds is of high importance to ensure our buildings look good and stay strong.

Clint Schiller was a guest presenter in Mr. Larson's Outdoor Science class.



Defensive Driving

4 hour refresher classes

To determine where to place a child, read class descriptions. You will have to make the determination yourself. If in doubt, go with the lower level. Each student will be tested the first day of class to determine if he/she is in the correct level. Students may sign up for more than one session after June 24th.

Little Swimmer

(Ages 6 months to 5 years)

Parent and Child Aquatics targets parents and their children ages 6 months to 5 years. The parents learn how to hold and support their child safely and appropriately while helping to increase their child's comfort level by emphasizing fun in the water. A foundation of basic skills will be built.

Preschool Levels 1 & 2 (Ages 3-5) Skills taught at this level include: water adjustment, breath control, floating, kicking and basic paddle strokes. Parents do not need to enter the water.

Level 1 (Intro to Water Skills)

Participants learn to enter and exit water; blow bubbles through mouth and nose, bobbing, open eyes under water, retrieve submerged objects; tread water; explore arm and hand movements.

Level 2 (Fundamental Skills)

Participants learn to enter/exit water; fully submerge & hold breath; front/back floats; tread water; roll over from front to back; changing direction, finning arm actions.

Level 3 (Stroke Development)

Builds on skills in level 2 by providing additional guided practice in deeper water. Will also learn to jump into deep water; bobbing while moving toward safety; headfirst entries from side-sitting and kneeling positions; survival float, back float; tread water; flutter, scissor and breaststroke; kicks on front; front crawl; simple non-swimming assists.

Level 4 (Stroke Improvement)

Develops student's confidence in the strokes learned in Level 3. Participants learn headfirst entries from side in compact and stride positions, swim under water, feet first surface dive, survival swimming; front crawl and backstroke open turns; tread water; front and back crawl; backstroke, breaststroke, sidestroke and butterfly.

Level 5 (Stroke Refinement)

Participants learn to shallow-angle dive from side and glide into a front stroke; tuck and pike surface dives, submerge completely; front flip turns and backstroke flip turn while swimming; front and back crawl, backstroke, breaststroke, sidestroke and butterfly.

Level 6 (Skill Proficiency)

Objectives are to refine strokes so participants swim with more ease, efficiency, power and smoothness; as well as swim over a great distance.


