To begin with, we are excited to have two new administrators join the Benson Schools Team. Both are BHS graduates and are passionate about our school and communities.

Brennan Kent is the new Northside Elementary Principal. Brennan previously served as a high school principal, assistant special education director, and special education teacher. Brennan brings many years of experience to the position.

Matt Ebnet is the new Benson Schools Activities Director. Matt earned a degree in Sports Management from the University of MN, Twin Cities. Matt has experience in program promotion, engaging student-athletes, coaches/advisors, parents, and community members. Matt has great ideas to increase fan experience and to support and growing BHS programs.

Both Brennan and Matt have hit the ground running.

Secondly, over the course of last year, the Benson School Board worked hard to update the District Strategic Plan. Through much discussion and valuable input from district residents, the board developed a plan around priorities that emerged from the survey responses. The focus continues to be "Exceptional Opportunities for Every Student's Success". To meet the mission, vision, and belief statements, 2022-2023 school year goal areas will be focused on:

- 1. offering additional Social, Emotional Learning Opportunities and supports for students;
- 2. providing increased Engagement and Communication for the school community and beyond;
- 3. providing more year-round learning opportunities in both academics and activities;
- 4. grow Individualized and Personalized opportunities.

These goals will lead to even better academic opportunities and student growth. We are excited to see the Strategic Plan come to life throughout this school year and directly benefit students.

Third, a safe and welcoming learning environment for every student is a top priority at Benson Schools. Our new state-of-the-art facilities are designed with controlled access at each building so people are not able to get beyond the office when students are in classes. While this is not always the most convenient for parents, it provides a high level of safety and security for students and staff. In addition, strong connections are made with students to get to know them, their interests, families, etc. These relationships build connections to schools.

In addition, school administrators have been meeting with local law enforcement and other agencies over the summer to strengthen crisis prevention and response plans. The meetings have been tremendously productive in building comprehensive plans for student and staff safety and security. Parents can send their students to school with confidence that their children are in a safe learning environment.

Fourth, the District launched a new website this summer. The website is updated, refreshed, and will be much easier to navigate and find information. Two main things that people wanted was an easy to read activity calendar and a prominent button to click to view events, both are easy to find on the home page. Finally, the pandemic has subsided and we are anxious to have a "normal" start to the school year for the first time in several years. Student Schedules:

- Many students have already changed their first semester schedule. However, if you still need to change your schedule, you can make these changes with Jason Strand starting August 17th. Changes must be made by 3:00 p.m. August 26th.
- Families new to the school district can stop by the BHS 6-12 Office and register for classes Monday-Friday from 7:30 a.m. until 3:30 p.m. beginning Monday, August 8th.

Things to Remember:

- BHS is a 1 to 1 technology school
 - 1. We have Chromebooks to sign out. You can complete your forms online or pick them up in the BHS Office. The insurance cost is \$40 per device or \$20 per device if you qualify for free/reduced lunch.
 - 2. Students are expected to either sign out a school device or bring their own device (laptop, Chromebook, tablet or iPad). These devices need to be brought to school fully charged daily.
 - 3. Student phones are not considered a device on which to complete school work.
- Doors are locked during the school day (8:00 a.m. 3:01 p.m.) with access to the BHS Office or Community Ed.
 Office by checking in through a video system by the main entrance.
- Buses drop students off and pick students up on the north side of BHS. Parent drop off is at the main entrance on the south side of BHS.

Strategic Plan Guides School Planning

During the 2022-2023 school year the Benson School Board engaged in the important and hard work of updating the Benson School strategic plan. The strategic plan serves as a road map to follow for where to direct time, resources, and energy to continue to elevate Benson Schools. The strategic plan is a basis for budgeting, policy, and other decisions.

How did the school board identify priorities for the strategic plan?

A survey was mailed to all parents and households in the district. In addition, ads were placed in the Monitor-News and on the Benson School Facebook page to notify people to complete the survey. There was a good number of surveys completed and the data from the surveys helped lead to areas of priority.

The mission: "Exceptional Opportunities for Every Student's Success" continues as that clearly defines what is done at Benson Schools.

Once the Vision, Mission, and Belief statements were completed by the school board, then administrators used the strategic plan, board discussion, and survey results to focus in on specific strategic goal areas. The goal areas identified include:

- Area #1: Bullying & Social Emotional Learning. During, and now coming out of the pandemic, there is an increase in mental health and social needs. Parents are also reporting more child specific needs. The District will address this area to provide additional supports.
- Area #2: Parent, Family, and Community Engagement and Communication. Survey results showed there are gaps between knowledge of the pubic and actual programs at Benson Schools. The District will work on communication strategies to fill in the gaps.
- Area #3: Year-Round Learning. Survey data showed a desire for more year-round learning opportunities both in academics and activities. This includes after school and summer opportunities. Enrichment opportunities was a common theme as well.
- Area #4: Individualized/Personalized Instruction. The District has been focused on this area for the past few years. With the technology available, there are additional ways to learn. In addition, this area includes pathways for students to explore their interests through a wide array of electives, college courses, internships, etc.

Thank you to everyone who took time to complete the survey and provide valuable feedback. We are excited to begin implementing the strategic plan and the difference it will make for students, parents, community members, and staff. We are excited for the many new strategies that will elevate learning for all Benson School Students. We cannot wait to have students back and begin the 2022-2023 school year and continue our important mission of providing "Exceptional Opportunities for Every Student's Success".

Meals are back to paid this year as the USDA did not continue the free meals program for the 2022-2023 school year. Please make sure you fill out the free/reduced meal application form to see if you qualify for the upcoming year. Remember if you did not fill out the application last year there is no carry over for the month

of September and you will be on paid status the first day of school. Even if you think you will not qualify please fill it out and try. We would like everyone to get help who qualifies!

The food service staff are gearing up for a normal year of serving meals. We are excited to have a "normal" year once again. We will be using the Biometric system once again for breakfast and lunch for grades K-12. If you have Kindergarten or new students please try to make time during open house to have your child's finger scanned.

Second Chance Breakfast will be available for grades 6-12. The high school students who will be eating both breakfast and lunch will have Grab & Go options, our regular lines, and a line 3 option with ala carte choices too.

There will be a few other changes and reminders for this fall...

- Milk and Snack break will be paid either annually or twice per year. Watch for the information sheet!
- We will be updating our online payment system by the end of September. This will make it easier for families and it will be in "real time".
- Please fill out the Student Allowed Charging form if you want any changes. The family balance must be positive for a student to charge anything.
- If your child has a Special Diet that has changed or is new, please fill out the forms found on the school website under: District, Food Service.

Procedures for Over Due Accounts Policy


Parents receive statements one of two ways:

- Via Email. If there is an email set up with the lunch account, low balance notices will be sent weekly to the email linked to the lunch account.
- Via Mail. If there is no email set up with the lunch account, physical low balance notices will be sent weekly.

Process for low balance notices:

- 1. Emails or physical notices will be sent on all accounts that are expected to go negative within 8 days.
- 2. When accounts reach a zero balance, parents will be notified via phone call that their students can no longer charge ala carte to their accounts until their account has a positive balance and payment on the account needs to be made within two weeks.
- 3. If no response or payment is made, a final notice will be mailed to the parents with the effective date of three school days to bring their account to a positive balance.
- 4. If payment is still not received, they will be turned over to collections.





- 3. We are anticipating a fall kick off dance camp experience where we will review techniques and forms. This will help refresh memories of positions, terminology and skills allowing our instructors to get right into learning routines when the classes start in January.
- 4. The recital is still set to take place in late April. The final date will be determined once the Prom date is set.

Once our camp dates and winter/spring dates are set, a flyer will be emailed out to all district students. Information will also be included in our Fall District Newsletter and posted on our Facebook page.

ECFE fees

All are welcome and no one will be denied access due to an inability to pay. A sliding fee scale is accessed for our families based on your income (after taxes).

Under \$19,999 - scholarships available \$20,000-\$49,999 - class fee of \$30 \$50,000-\$74,999 - class fee of \$40 \$75,000 and up - class fee of \$50

EARLY CHILDHOOD SCREENING All preschoolers who will be 4 years old on or before September 1, 2022 are eligible to be screened. This program provides a comprehensive health and development screening once before the childhood enters Kindergarten. You will receive a letter prior to the screening date.

Preschool Options

Voluntary Pre-K (VPK) & School Readiness are public school programs for 3 to 5 year old children and their families.

VPK & School Readiness provide children with various opportunities to participate in early childhood programs that enable them to enter school with the skills and behaviors needed for them to progress and flourish.

We offer these options this year:

The **3 year old School Readiness program** is for those students who will be 3 on or before September 1st and in Kindergarten in the fall of 2024. Student must be fully potty trained.

Cost is \$75.00 a month. Pathway Scholarships are available for families qualifying based on income and services.

The program meets two days a week on Tuesdays & Thursdays from 8:00-10:45 in the Early Childhood Center at Northside Elementary.

Our **4 year old VPK program is** designed for those students who will be 4 on or before September 1st and in Kindergarten in the fall of 2023.

We have three options for VPK this year. All classes meet from 7:50-2:50 in the Early Childhood Center at Northside Elementary.

2-Day Class: Tues. & Thurs.; Free 3-Day Class: Mon., Weds., Fri.; Free 5-Day Class: Mon.-Fri.; \$100 a month

Both the 3 and 4 year old programs are designed around social skills, academic skills, play, pre-kindergarten basics, fine and large motor skill development, and many other exciting experiences.
